

It seems that there are now three gay liberation groups in Nolsourne: one at each of the universities.

The largest and most established of these is the Helbourne University Cay biberation Front, a big proportion of its members being non-students. MUGLF appears to be the main focal point for gay lib activities in Helbourne but its membership is by no means limited to homosexuals or bisexuals. Going by reports the non-homosexual group appears to be made up of heterosexuals of people calling themselves "numan sexuals", whatever that tag might imply. It would seem that there has been some polarisation of these groups of late following a lot of dissatisfaction on the part of some of the people who are exclusively homosexual or bisexual.

The MUGLF Publications Group in a pamphlet entitled: "Neterosexuals in Gay Lib: Queens and Dykes want Gay Lib back" argued that while they were not prepared to say categorically at this stage that heterosexuals should be excluded, there were enormous problems. They pointed out, and I would agree, that the development of a radical gay consciousness was fra the with problems.

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anyway, and that attempts to arrive at some consensus of issues to be discussed, to encompass straights, has meant a watering down of the specific issues of homosexual oppression, especially in CR groups. They cited the examples of Black Power and Women's Liberation where whites and men (respectively) were excluded on a similar basis.

It seems to me that "the poofters and dykes who want gay lib back" have shown remarkable patience in the face of a peculiar situation. Elsewhere in their panahlet they pointed out that the prescence of large numbers of non-homosexuals in Gav Liberation seems to be unique to the Melbourne group, no-one having ever heard of it in either Britain or Morth Werica. That's hardly surprising of course because there's no doubt elsewhere that "gay liberation" is synonymous for "homosexual liberation" (the ... American term 'gay' , for homosexual being co-opted, as the movement first began there).

Paced with this unique situation what are homosexuals of HUGLE to do? It's relatively easy to make judgements from afar of course, but it may be that they feer being labelled authoritrians if they do state categorically that heterosexuals ought to be excluded from the group, but for the sorts of reasons outlimed above I think this decision is justified. or rather imperative.

To make chargespot "authoritarianism" in this context would be a gross misapplification of the concept. Similarly, revorted charges of "sexism" and "thettoism" against the arguments of the "poofters and dykes" indicates that the "gay" is not the only word that has taken on curious new meanings for some people in the group.
